The theme for the 2024 IWOC Awards was ‘Women and girls are leading the charge for their rights and for human rights and democracy around the world.’



The 2024 IWOC recipients were Fátima Corozo (Ecuador), Benafsha Yaqoobi (Afghanistan), Fawzia Karim Firoze (Bangladesh), Volha Harbunova (Belarus), Ajna Jusić (Bosnia and Herzegovina), Myintzu Win (Burma), Martha Beatriz Roque Cabello (Cuba), Fatou Baldeh (The Gambia), Rabha El Haymar (Morocco), Rina Ganoi (Japan), and Agather Atuhaire (Uganda).

Established in 2007, this annual award honors women from around the world who have demonstrated exceptional courage, strength, and leadership in order to bring about positive change to their communities, often at great personal risk and sacrifice. To date, under the IWOC program, the U.S. Department of State has recognized more than 190 women in 90 countries.

Under the High Patronage of His Serene Highness Prince Albert, with the support of the Princely Government, and in collaboration with Monaco's Embassy and its honorary consulates in Canada, the Monaco Boys Choir kicked off their 2024 concert tour of Canada on July 4.

The modern-day version of this award-winning Choir was founded by Prince Rainier in 1974 to showcase Monaco’s historic association with culture and the performing arts.

It is a part of the Monaco Cathedral Choir and is composed of talented children from ages eight to 18, who traditionally embark on a spring tour of Europe and an international summer tour.

The Choir, well-known for their repertoire for children, have visited more than 35 nations and perform an average of 30 to 40 concerts a year.

The musical program includes works by Charpentier, Mozart, Bach, Mendelssohn, Fauré and Franck; French, Monégasque and English-language songs, and patriotic US anthems.

The prestigious Galien Foundation presented their annual Roy Vagelos Pro Bono Humanum Award to HSH Prince Albert in 2024. This distinguished prize celebrates His Highness's unwavering commitment, through the Prince Albert II of Monaco Foundation, to environmental stewardship and humanitarian efforts that positively impact our world. The honor was accepted on His Highness's behalf by his cousin and president of the Prince Albert II of Monaco Foundation-USA, Mr. John 'J.B.' Kelly at the National Museum of Natural History in New York City in the fall.



In mid-April Monaco formally joined more than 60 other nations on the Greening Government Initiative (GGI) and was welcomed by White House Council on Environmental Quality's Chair Brenda Mallory (left). The GGI pledges to increase the environmental sustainability of national government operations. Through GGI, nations share best practices, showcase innovation, and collaborate to advance their greening work.



Conservation and Africa's future were discussed at the May 22 (ICCF) International Conservation Caucus Foundation lunch featuring Kenya's President H.E. Dr. William Samoei Ruto, the US Congressional International Conservation Caucus and the Oceans and the Climate Solutions Caucuses, and environmental foundation supporters and guests.



The Embassy of Monaco joined forces with the Swiss Embassy at the French Embassy on April 22 to focus on glaciers and the importance of preserving them at a special seminar with the Ice Memory Foundation. The Foundation aims to create, in the Antarctica, an international repository of ice cores from glaciers in danger of degradation or disappearance. Meetings covered topics including living on a sustainable planet, tropical forests and the global climate, resilience, and vibrant tropical oceans.

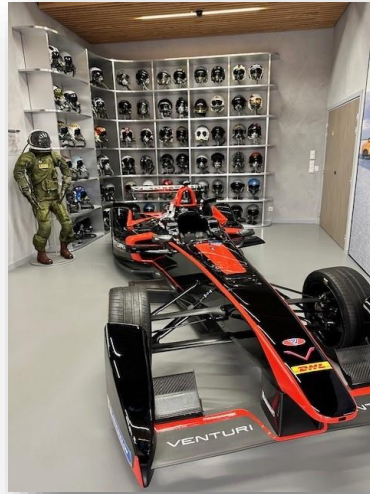
